Australian 1962 Valiants

The Chrysler Valiant was first introduced into Australia in January of 1962. They were locally assembled from parts imported from the USA where Chrysler produced Valiants were sold through their Plymouth dealerships.



It was in March of 1962 that Chrysler introduced the "S" Series Valiant and by the March of 1963 all of the 10,009 units produced had been sold.



The "R" Series first went on sale in January 1962 and all 1008 were sold in less than 3 months – by March 1962.



The "S" Series is very similar in appearance to the "R" Series with outward cosmetic changes distinguishing it from its predecessor. Removed was the fake wheel mold on the boot lid, the "cat's eyes" tail lights were changed to a more conventional tail light assembly, a different grille installed and changes to much of the chrome work. The floor mounted manual shift was moved to the steering column plus several other mechanical alterations were included.

The "R" series came with a choice of 3 speed floor mounted manual transmission, or the 3 speed TORQUEFLITE automatic transmission which was engaged using press buttons to the right of the instrument cluster.

The unique shape of the "R" and "S" Series Valiant lasted less than 15 months before the first Australian production Valiant - a vastly different looking model – the AP5, was introduced in March 1963.
